Emergency Action Plan



EMERGENCY ACTION PLAN DESCRIPTION

Sport injuries can happen anytime, an Emergency Action Plan (EAP) is an important tool to assist the KASL community should an emergency arise. All KASL recreational team coaches are encouraged to come up with their own EAP for their practice site. Since KASL recreational teams practice throughout different locations in the surrounding Kenosha County area, each park is unique. However, basically guidelines below can assist if an emergency comes up at the KASL fields located at Anderson Soccer Complex

There are four key components to an EAP:

- 1) Access to phones
- 2) Directions
- 3) Player Information
- 4) EAP Personnel

The head coach or the most qualified in First Aid and Emergency procedures will:

- Know what emergency equipment is available at your facility
- Secure a controlled and calm environment (advise assistant coaches to take team away from the injured player)
- Assess and tend to the injured player; determine if an ambulance is needed
- Direct others until medical personnel arrive

KASL's office building will have a First Aid Kit, AED, and ice. It is recommended that all coaches have some sort of First Aid Kit in their coaching bag at practices and games.

In the event an ambulance is needed please follow the steps below:

- Call 9-1-1
- Provide all necessary information to dispatch (including location, nature of injurie(s), description of First Aid that has been done)
- Call the KASL administrator or KASL president or have someone come to the KASL office building immediately.
- Assist with having road access before the ambulance arrives and clear any traffic from the entrance/access road before ambulance arrives
- Wait by the road to guide the ambulance when it arrives

Emergency Action Plan Check List

Access to Phones – Make sure cell phones and battery are well charged before your game.

Directions – Make sure you have the correction directions, address, and field locations for all practices and KASL home games

Player Information – To insure player safety during an emergency please make contact with your parents to see if any players have any known medical conditions or pre-existing medical conditions. This will be helpful if an emergency arises and EMS is needed.

****First Aid Kit** should be accessible in your coaching bag at all times. Please check it regularly to make sure all supplies are fully stocked and products are not past the expiration dates.

Severe Weather

Severe Weather can occur at anytime. A severe weather radar detector is located on top of the KASL building. If severe weather is detected the sirens will go off. When sirens go off, play should be suspended immediately. All players, coaches, and spectators should go directly into their vehicles. All referees and KASL personnel should go directly to the KASL office. Once severe weather has cleared (typically 30 minutes after the last lightning strike) play can be resumed.
